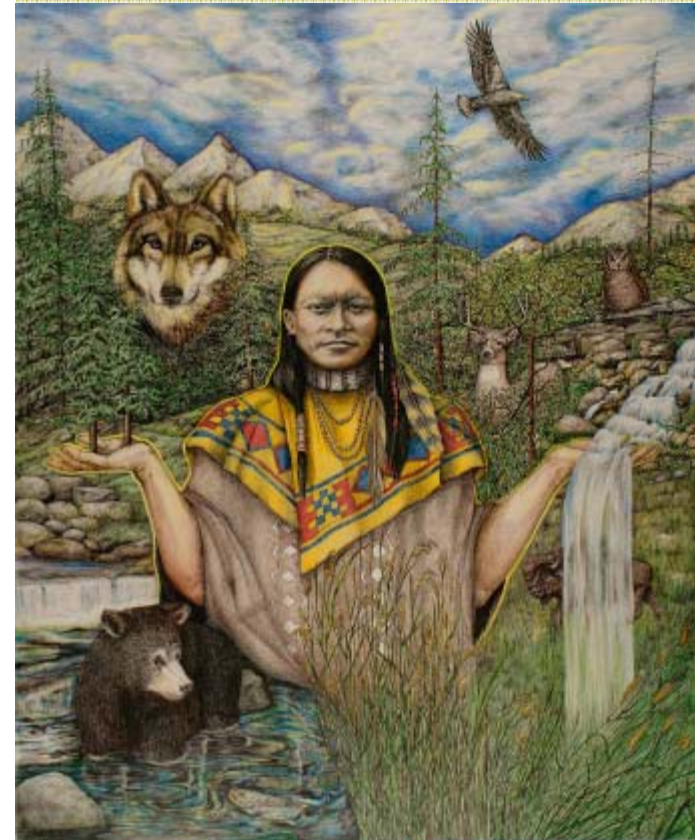

# TRIBAL COLLEGE FELLOWS INSTITUTE FACULTY DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP



The National Science Foundation (NSF) awarded a grant (NSF DUE Project Number: 0702247) to the Partnership for Environmental Technology Education (PETE) to provide technical assistance and professional development training to Tribal Colleges across the United States.



The Advanced Technology Environmental and Energy Center (ATEEC) is an instrumental partner in the project.



The project calls for faculty workshops in 2009 and 2010. The 2009 workshop focused on water quality, and was held at Sitting Bull College in Fort Yates, ND.

This year's professional development workshop -known as the *Tribal College Fellows Institute*- will focus on the topic of **water management and pollution prevention**. It will be held at **Salish Kootenai College** in Pablo, Montana

Attendees will be chosen through a competitive application process. The workshop is available to U.S. Tribal college and high school faculty.



Chosen applicants will focus on the following instructional outcomes:

### **Outcome 1**

Increased knowledge of water management and pollution prevention, with a focus on first-hand field and laboratory learning.

### **Outcome 2**

Development and implementation of a personal action plan for dissemination of workshop outcomes and use in academic programs.
